

NURSING–TRAINERS, ASSAM AND WEST BENGAL

ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

Ipas Development Foundation (IDF) works to increase women’s ability to exercise their sexual and reproductive rights, especially the right to safe abortion and contraceptive services. IDF seeks to eliminate unsafe abortion and the resulting deaths and injuries and to expand women’s access to contraception, comprehensive abortion care and related reproductive health information and care. Towards this, IDF works in strengthening training systems, service delivery of comprehensive contraception and abortion care, and access to these services within the public health system, with the aim of making a positive impact on the health of women in India. IDF’s program currently spans 12 states to include the states of Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Odisha, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal.

OVERVIEW OF THE POSITIONS

IDF seeks to hire Nursing –Trainers to be based in Assam and West Bengal. The positions report to the Assistant Manager-Programs (AMP) in the states, and will be a part of the Mobile Training Team (MTT) supporting the Medical Officer-Training (MO-T) for conducting on-site Comprehensive Contraceptive Care (CCC) training focusing on Intra-Uterine Contraceptive Device (IUCD), Postpartum Intra-Uterine Contraceptive Device (PPIUCD), Post Abortion Intra-Uterine Contraceptive Device (PAIUCD) and other new contraceptive methods like MPA. The training is conducted for eligible providers in the facilities at district and sub-district level. In addition, the positions will be responsible for providing ongoing mentoring support to trained providers. The Nursing –Trainer positions are open at the following locations:

- Guwahati, Assam
- Malda, West Bengal

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The responsibilities of the Nursing–Trainers will include the following:

- Demonstrate use of different checklists during the training, infection prevention and waste management at the site and motivate trained providers to implement the same.
- Strengthen recording of contraceptive and abortion care services at the intervention sites.
- Orient staff and other counselors in the intervention facilities on women’s rights with respect to family planning services and address misconceptions.
- Conduct pre- and post-training assessments for the trainees and collect feedback. Prepare reports based on analysis and share with AMP and Manager-Programs.
- Ensure upkeep and maintenance of materials and equipment issued to the MTT.
- Support the MTT in adopting innovative training methodology to increase its effectiveness.
- Work with other members of the MTT to develop work plans to identify intervention sites and trained providers requiring additional training and support.
- Provide on-site post training and clinical mentoring support to the trained providers and ensure high quality service delivery.
- Support the MTT in collection of baseline information of the facilities, enrollment of trained providers in Unnati network and collection of data from intervention sites.
- Document support visits conducted, actions taken and update the AMP and other members of the MTT.

- In consultation with the facility-in-charge and trained providers, identify challenges and areas for performance improvement at the facility regarding high quality contraceptive services to the clients.
- Support the MO-T and other IDF staff to conduct audits of the facility to ensure quality, choice and right based services to women.
- Carry out any other duties as needed within the scope of this position and provide any other programmatic assistance, as may be required.

QUALIFICATION AND EXPERIENCE

Candidates suitable for the positions:

- Degree in Bachelor of Science in Nursing or Bachelor of Science in Nursing (post basic) or General Nursing & Midwifery or Master of Science in Nursing with a major in midwifery.
- A minimum of 1-3 years' experience of working on reproductive health, preferably in the area of family planning/midwifery. Freshers may also apply.
- Prior experience of working with international and national level NGOs, health departments and public health facilities.
- Prior experience of conducting class room and skill training, Intra-Uterine Contraceptive Device (IUCD) training will be preferred.
- Ability to strategically plan and work in a team.
- Ability to read, write and speak the regional language (Assamese for position in Assam and Bengali for position in West Bengal) is a must. Additionally, a working knowledge of English and Hindi.
- Ability to travel 70% of the time to district/sub-district/block level program areas.
- Relevant experience from any part of India with a willingness to relocate to Assam or West Bengal.
